• Eggplant

Small fruited varieties like Fairytale and Patio Baby

• Herbs

Basil, oregano, thyme, tosemary, sage, lavender, marjoram, chives, mint, tarragon, shiso, salad burnet, dill, parsley, lemon verbena

- Swiss chard
- Persian cucumber
- Bush beans
- Strawberries
